

Fire Extinguishers

Use the right one at the right time.

Fire extinguishers are labeled according to type of fire they're designed to put out.

- ➤ <u>Class A fires</u> consist of ordinary combustibles, such as wood, paper or cloth, and can be put out with water.
- Class B fires consist of flammable liquids. Drychemical extinguishers are usually used.
- Class C fires involve energized electrical equipment. Water can't be used because it conducts electricity and can deliver a shock. Carbon dioxide and drychemical extinguishers are best.
- Class D fires involve combustible metals. Special drycompound powders are used.

Using the wrong type of extinguisher, or using one improperly, could cause additional injuries and property damage. Know the difference.
